
FSW Honored by Metro Justice

At the Metro Justice annual dinner on Sunday June 4th 2023 the Monroe County Federation of Social Workers was honored with an award for Partners in Justice. FSW members have endorsed and worked on Metro Justice campaigns over the last year, as well as volunteered many hours and served on the Metro Justice Council. Rochester for Energy Democracy (RED) is a campaign to explore the possibility of brining a large scale public utility company to the larger metropolitan area. The Campaign for NY Health strives to make single payer healthcare a reality in NYS. FAIR CONTRACT NOW! We are more than 40 dedicated healthcare workers at Rochester Centers for Rehabilitation & Nursing. Our 1199SEIU union contract expired December 31, 2022. We have been fighting for a fair contract that helps to recruit and retain dedicated workers to help care for residents.

We have a staffing crisis in our facility and have been working chronically short staffed. We are demanding dignity and respect on the job. We are asking Centers Health Care to provide living wages, affordable benefits and to maintain daily overtime.

Our wages have fallen well below other healthcare workers in the area making it hard for workers to stay when they can go elsewhere for higher wages or get paid more without critical benefits they need to care for their family.

Instead of negotiating competitive wages and affordable healthcare benefits, management refuses to offer us a livable wage that compensates all workers. Management wants to cut benefits we need to care for our family in favor of higher pay—and that's not right. We deserve benefits and higher wages!

We are dedicated to our residents we provide care for daily. We love our jobs and our residents. It's time for Centers Health Care to make quality care a priority by agreeing to a new union contract that provides wage increases, benefits, and maintains daily overtime to help retain and recruit more workers to care for residents.




