

Joint Education and Training Fund for FSW members, Article 14.

The objective of the program is to promote Federation of Social Worker Bargaining Unit Education and Training activities, by rewarding the bargaining unit for participation in training initiatives that are above or outside the minimum required within their job title by allowing them to earn a fleece, or a lunch cooler, i.e. 1 per achievement.

FSW Bargaining Unit can earn 1 fleece pullover, or 1 lunch cooler, when they have achieved one of the following education or training activities:

- Completed a college course in 2025
- Completed a degree program in 2025
- Taught a DHS or MCH sponsored or approved course in 2025
- Completed 35 training hours in HSLC within a 12-month period beginning 1/1/2025.
- Presented at a work-related conference NYPWA, NYWFIA, etc. in 2025
- Been nominated by your administrator as earning a significant education or training achievement by completing or participating in an activity other than those outlined above.
- Completed 12 CEU Credits in a 12-month Period

#### Please note:

- The incentive/reward program is a yearly incentive program. The new program year starts 01/01/2025
- 2. There is a total limit of one fleece pullover, and one lunch cooler tote per FSW Bargaining Unit member. See attachment for photos of items!

# SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

#### Ed Grabowski/Dina Finn Memorial Scholarship Application

Thank you for choosing to apply for one of two Federation of Social Workers' Scholarships. Listed below are the eligibility criteria:

- Applicants pursuing a higher degree must be the child or grandchild of a current FSW member or a current member of FSW Retiree Council in good standing, or FSW member in good standing must be the legal guardian to the applicant.
- 2. Applicants must have participated in at least 5 hours of FSW sponsored labor movement activities in the last 4 years. Documentation may be required.
- 3. Completed Ed Grabowski/Dina Finn Memorial Scholarship Application.
- 4. In the event that two approved applications for a child or grandchild are not received by July 18, 2025, applications will then be opened to any current FSW member pursuing a higher degree, with a deadline of August 15, 2025.
