Sen. Fetterman Introduces Legislation That Would Make Striking Workers Eligible for SNAP Benefits

Sen. John Fetterman of Pennsylvania, chair of the U.S. Senate nutrition subcommittee, introduced legislation that <u>would make striking workers eligible for Supplemental Nutrition As-</u> <u>sistance Program (SNAP) benefits</u>. "Every union worker who is walking the picket line this summer needs to know that we have their back here in Washington," Fetterman said. "The union way of life is sacred. It's what built Pennsylvania and this nation. It is critical for us to protect workers' right to organize, and that includes making sure they and their families have the resources to support themselves while on strike."




This is only the beginning and the future holds immense potential. Thank you for your faith in me, and let's embrace this new era of CWA with hope, determination, trust, and transparency.






