Members are reporting issues with taking the survey. The most common issue is not being able to take the survey without a Google account. Most smart phones have a Google account attached to it. Some members found they were able to take the survey after they entered the web address into the browser on their phone as opposed to a laptop or desktop. You can also use a Google account of someone else (friend/co-worker/family member) just to take the survey. None of their information will be attached to the survey, not even the account information used to take the survey, you would be entering all of your own information on the survey. You will need to enter a valid email address to take the survey - it can be any valid email address and not attached to a Google account.

If you do not have a Google account and do not want to make one you will still be able to take the survey. We will have Chromebooks set up at the Family Fun Night on Tuesday for you to take the survey. On April 1st 2023 FSW members held endorsement interviews at the FSW union hall. Members took this opportunity to ask candidates running for office questions about their priorities and discussed the concerns of the membership. Mark Assini, County Executive candidate, was interviewed first. County Legislature candidates Alan Richards, Santos Cruz, and Nadja Justice were interviewed next as a panel.

Endorsement interviews continue this Saturday April 8th at 2 pm. Adam Bello, County Executive, will be first. At 3 pm we will have a panel of County Legislature candidates including Will Burgess, Mercedes Vásquez Simmons, Rachel Barnhart, and Carolyn Delvecchio Hoffman. At 4 we will hear from County Leg candidates Oscar Brewer and Rose Bonnick.

After this Saturday's meeting the members will make their recommendations for endorsements. The recommendations are then heard by the Executive Board on April 18th but ultimately voted by the general membership at the General membership meeting on April 19th 2023.

This round of endorsement interviews included only those County Leg candidates with a primary. The County Executive race was included in order to make an early endorsement. More endorsement interviews, will be held towards the end of summer.


